

## Spelling list: o-e words - set 1

A split digraph is a spelling pattern where two letters, typically a vowel and an "e," work together to create a single sound in a word, even though they are separated by another letter. In this list, split digraph o-e is used to spell the long /o/ sound. By adding the e, you make the o say its name.

Here are some examples of how adding an e turns a short /o/ sound into a long /o/ sound:

*Cod + e = code*

*Hop + e = hope*

*Robe + e = robe*

Click on the *speaker icon* next to each word. Can you hear the long /o/ sounds?

robe	A kimono is a Japanese <b>robe</b> .
globe	Climate change will affect people across the <b>globe</b> .
code	The spy knew the secret <b>code</b> .
joke	The <b>joke</b> was funny.
smoke	The fire made lots of <b>smoke</b> .
stroke	He won the golf match by one <b>stroke</b> .
stole	He did not have a clue who <b>stole</b> his bike.
dome	The mosque has a <b>dome</b> on the roof.
home	The <b>home</b> team had the advantage.
bone	Have you ever broken a <b>bone</b> ?
stone	His sculpture was carved from a block of <b>stone</b> .
hope	I <b>hope</b> you come to my party.
slope	She slid down the <b>slope</b> .
hose	The <b>hose</b> spat out a jet of water.

vote	Please <b>vote</b> for me to be school captain.
quote	The news reporter asked to <b>quote</b> him.
stove	The fire started to crackle in the <b>stove</b> .
froze	The pipes <b>froze</b> and now they leak.
chose	He <b>chose</b> to abstain from alcohol.
