

## Spelling list: ow words

The long o sound at the end of a word is often spelled with the letters ow . This spelling is used in many English words, making it a key pattern to learn. Knowing how to spell ow words correctly will help improve your overall spelling skills.

For example:

*blow* – *blow* out the candles on your cake.

*show* – Tick the box to *show* you have read the text.

*flow* – The stream will *flow* down the mountain.

Learning this pattern will help you remember how to spell these words more easily.

blow	<b>Blow</b> out the candles on your cake.
flow	The crowd will <b>flow</b> through the gates.
show	Tick the box to <b>show</b> you have read the text.
throw	Don't <b>throw</b> your clothes on the floor.
arrow	The archer was down to his last <b>arrow</b> .
below	He lives in the rooms <b>below</b> me.
borrow	Could I <b>borrow</b> some milk?
elbow	A blow on the <b>elbow</b> can be painful.
fellow	That <b>fellow</b> keeps looking at me.
follow	Don't <b>follow</b> me, I'm lost.
hollow	The tree trunk was <b>hollow</b> .
meadow	Cows are grazing in the <b>meadow</b> .
narrow	Our car got stuck in a <b>narrow</b> lane.
pillow	I like to sleep with a big <b>pillow</b> .

shadow	The evening sun cast a long <b>shadow</b> .
shallow	The <b>shallow</b> water is marked by a buoy.
sorrow	<b>Sorrow</b> is a feeling of great sadness.
swallow	A <b>swallow</b> was flying up above.
bungalow	They lived in a small <b>bungalow</b> by the sea.
tomorrow	I'll call you again <b>tomorrow</b> .
