

## Spelling list: -o words - technical

In this list, the long -o sound at the end of each technical term is spelled with just the letter o . These words are often used in scientific or technological contexts.

For instance, *stereo* refers to sound that comes from two or more directions, giving a sense of depth. *Video* and *audio* are terms used to describe visual and sound content. Some words, such as *dynamo* and *micro* , are rooted in scientific principles —a *dynamo* creates electricity and *micro* means *very small* .

Learning these words will help you become more familiar with technology-related language.

stereo	Our new TV has <b>stereo</b> sound.
video	You can freeze the <b>video</b> at any time.
audio	The <b>audio</b> speaker was turned up too loud.
disco	They danced at the <b>disco</b> until the early hours.
dynamo	Some bike lights are worked by a <b>dynamo</b> .
micro	<b>Micro</b> means very small.
radio	The <b>radio</b> began to transmit the message.
mono	<b>Mono</b> means one.
