

## Spelling list: -o words - a mixture

This list features a wide variety of words that all end with the long -o sound spelled with just the letter o . The words belong to different categories, from objects to actions to natural phenomena.

For instance, *cargo* refers to goods transported by ship, plane, or vehicle, while *halo* describes the glowing circle often depicted around angels. Words like *tornado* and *volcano* refer to dramatic forces of nature. Others, such as *studio* and *memo* , are everyday terms used in creative and professional contexts.

This mixed list is great for exploring the versatility of the -o ending.
