

## Spelling list: Words ending in / + suffix (British English)

In British English, double the final letter when you add a suffix to words ending in a single vowel followed by / .

cancelled	The football official <b>cancelled</b> the match.
counsellor	Jane is a marriage guidance <b>counsellor</b> .
equalled	Her achievement would never be <b>equalled</b> .
fuelling	The car needs <b>fuelling</b> .
fuelled	<b>Fuelled</b> by determination, Hercules defeated the lion.
grovelling	I tried <b>grovelling</b> but my parents still wouldn't let me go to the party.
jeweller	The <b>jeweller</b> created a beautiful broach from silver and gold.
jewellery	The king wore a lot of <b>jewellery</b> .
levelled	The builders <b>levelled</b> the ground in preparation for the new building.
marvellous	We had a <b>marvellous</b> time on holiday.
modelling	Mrs Nobles presses the <b>modelling</b> clay together to make it flat.
panelled	The walls were <b>panelled</b> .
quarrelling	He was <b>quarrelling</b> again with his sister.
revelled	They <b>revelled</b> in the good news.
woollen	He wore a <b>woollen</b> jacket.
