

Spelling list: Year 2, Term 2, Week 5: Words ending *ed* , *er* and *est* after *y*

This list features words that change the *y* to *i* before adding suffixes like *-ed* , *-er* , and *-est* . Understanding this rule will help students form correct past tenses and comparisons.

chilliest	Winter is the chilliest time of year.
eye	I have something in my eye .
frying	They cooked breakfast in a frying pan.
funnier	The second comedian in the show was a lot funnier than the first.
happier	I felt happier after I had seen my friend.
happiest	It was the happiest day of my life.
hour	The train passes our house every hour .
luckiest	I felt like the luckiest person in the whole world!
skiing	The skiing expedition was an adventure.
spied	He spied his friend hiding behind the bush.
