

Spelling list: Year 3, Term 3, Week 3: *il-* and *im-* prefixes

This week teaches more prefixes that mean 'not'. Use *il-* and *im-* in words like 'illegal' or 'imperfect'. Listen for how they sound.

illegal	The traffic warden gave me a ticket for illegal parking.
illegible	Her handwriting was nearly illegible .
illiterate	An illiterate person cannot read or write.
immature	Mother and Son: John is the emotionally immature son bound to look after his bed ridden mother in 'Mother and Son'.
immobile	To be immobile means to be unable to move.
impatient	She was feeling impatient and tired of waiting.
imperfect	It didn't fit because it was imperfect .
impolite	He asked an impolite question.
increase	This year has seen an increase in how much tax I pay.
island	Jack is one of the older boys stranded on the island and becomes the leader of the hunters.
