mysterious	We were flummoxed by the <b>mysterious</b> phone call.
obvious	If something is explicit, it means it is stated in an <b>obvious</b> way.
precious	An emerald is a <b>precious</b> stone.
serious	He had a <b>serious</b> expression on his face.
spontaneous	There was <b>spontaneous</b> applause when he spoke.
various	They filmed at <b>various</b> sites.
vicious	The snarling dog looked <b>vicious</b> .
