sings	My mum <b>sings</b> to herself while she is cooking.
searches	She <b>searches</b> high and low.
hopes	David <b>hopes</b> to excel in his science exam.
waving	I like <b>waving</b> to passing trains.
reaches	She <b>reaches</b> for the highest shelf.
smiling	There were lots of happy, <b>smiling</b> children in Mrs Stapleton's class.
liked	Picasso <b>liked</b> to daub paint onto canvas.
baking	Grease the <b>baking</b> tin with butter.
planner	Mrs Mercer's <b>planner</b> is covered with lists.
