

## Spelling list: -ore - longer words

If the sound /or/ is on the end of a word it is usually spelled -ore .

adore	I <b>adore</b> your new dress.
before	Clean your shoes <b>before</b> you pack them.
deplore	I <b>deplore</b> your bad manners.
explore	Let's <b>explore</b> that old building.
galore	There were apples <b>galore</b> on the tree.
ignore	Kevin chose to <b>ignore</b> the warning.
implore	We <b>implore</b> you to stop that awful noise.
restore	We want to buy and <b>restore</b> an old house.
therefore	Tom is a minor and <b>therefore</b> too young to vote.
carnivore	A <b>carnivore</b> eats only meat.
herbivore	A <b>herbivore</b> eats only plants.
omnivore	Omnivores are animals that eat both plants and animals.
