

## Spelling list: *augh* and *ough* words

This word list focuses on words that use the letter combinations *augh* or *ough* to spell the /or/ sound. These combinations may seem tricky at first, but they're quite common in English and appear in a range of words, from describing a *fraught* situation to talking about a *naughty* child. Understanding how *augh* and *ough* work together to represent this sound will make it easier to identify and spell these words correctly. Take a look at the examples below to get started, then try a *spelling game* .

fraught	There was a <b>fraught</b> silence.
naughty	The <b>naughty</b> child needed supervision.
daughter	Our <b>daughter</b> is eleven years old.
slaughter	The lambs were taken to <b>slaughter</b> .
nought	<b>Nought</b> is another word for nothing.
thought	I <b>thought</b> the film was really good.
