

Spelling list: *alk* and *oar* words

In this word list, we'll focus on words that use *alk* and *oar* to spell the /or/ sound. These combinations can be found in a variety of words, like *walk* , *talk* , *chalk* , and *soar* . Understanding these patterns will help you improve both your spelling and pronunciation. By studying words like *roar* , *board* , and *hoard* , you'll gain confidence in identifying and using these spelling patterns correctly.

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| walk | It took an hour for us to walk home. |
| talk | Don't talk with your mouth full. |
| chalk | These cliffs are made of chalk . |
| stalk | He trimmed the stalk on each flower. |
| oar | I lost an oar over the side of my boat. |
| boar | A boar is a male pig or a wild pig. |
| roar | I heard the roar of a wild animal. |
| soar | I saw a glider soar above the clouds. |
| board | The seat was just a wooden board . |
| coarse | His trousers were made of a coarse material. |
| hoard | He hid his hoard of cash under the bed. |
| hoarse | His voice is hoarse . |
