these	Some of <b>these</b> words are hard to spell.
live	I saw a rock band performing <b>live</b> last night.
give	I'll <b>give</b> you a hand with your project.
done	What have I <b>done</b> with my car keys?
some	Would you like <b>some</b> fish and chips?
come	I'll <b>come</b> round to your house.
once	I'll only tell you <b>once</b> .
said	Did you hear what I <b>said</b> ?
before	Clean your shoes <b>before</b> you pack them.
