

## Spelling list: Non-statutory words: spelt ough (copy)

ough is one of the trickiest spellings in English it can be used to spell a number of different sounds.

ought	You really <b>ought</b> to see that film.
bought	I <b>bought</b> this dress at the new boutique.
thought	I <b>thought</b> you'd be ready by now.
nought	<b>Nought</b> means nothing. (US spelling: naught).
brought	The maid <b>brought</b> the tea on a tray.
fought	The swordsmen <b>fought</b> a duel.
rough	The path was <b>rough</b> and rocky.
tough	This meat is far too <b>tough</b> to eat.
enough	A dozen eggs will be <b>enough</b> .
cough	David has a bad cold and a <b>cough</b> .
though	Even <b>though</b> it's winter the weather is not cold.
although	<b>Although</b> I'm sick I'll still go to work.
dough	Knead the <b>dough</b> to make the pizza.
through	He kicked the ball <b>through</b> the window.
thorough	This room needs a <b>thorough</b> clean.
borough	The <b>borough</b> council studied the idea very thoroughly.
Plough	<b>Plough</b> the fields before sowing the seed.
bough	The main branch of tree is called a <b>bough</b> .
