

## Spelling list: Words with doubled letters (Y6 2018)

These words are examples of the doubling rule: when a word ends in a short vowel and one consonant we must double the consonant when adding a vowel suffix.

flapping	Stop <b>flapping</b> that paper at me.
getting	My spelling is <b>getting</b> much better.
runner	Will is the fastest <b>runner</b> in the school.
spotted	We <b>spotted</b> a kingfisher on the river bank.
biggish	I would like a <b>biggish</b> burger but not a huge one.
jogger	That <b>jogger</b> covers five miles every day.
funny	Bob's wedding speech was very <b>funny</b> .
snobbish	I don't like <b>snobbish</b> people.
snappy	He has a very <b>snappy</b> way of talking.
setting	I took a great picture of the <b>setting</b> sun.
hidden	I have <b>hidden</b> my sweets from my brother.
trodden	I think you have <b>trodden</b> in something smelly.
dipped	I <b>dipped</b> my foot in the freezing water.
travelled	The cars <b>travelled</b> over the suspension bridge.
stopped	The sailors <b>stopped</b> to work on the pontoon.
