

## Spelling list: The /n l/ sound after n

To spell the sound /n l/ at the end of a word use *al* or *el* .

criminal	The <b>criminal</b> and his accomplice were jailed.
diagonal	A <b>diagonal</b> brace is used to add strength to scaffolding.
eternal	Only an <b>eternal</b> optimist would expect success.
external	The old house has <b>external</b> walls made from sandstone.

internal	The ribs protect many <b>internal</b> organs, such as the heart.
national	When the prince married, there was a <b>national</b> holiday.
signal	The ship sent out a distress <b>signal</b> .
channel	The rain water was passed through an underground <b>channel</b> .
flannel	I use a <b>flannel</b> to clean my face.
funnel	I used a <b>funnel</b> to fill the jar.
kennel	Some dogs live outside in a <b>kennel</b> .
tunnel	The cave explorers had to wriggle through the <b>tunnel</b> .
