

## Spelling list: English 3

### Language devices

conjunction	A <b>conjunction</b> is a word that joins other words together.
repetition	When a word is used more than once, it is called <b>repetition</b> .
direct	<b>Direct</b> speech involves the narrator giving the exact words spoken (or thought) by the character, almost always enclosed in speech marks, and often (but not always) with a reporting clause (such as 'said Jim').
indirect	<b>Indirect</b> speech involves the narrator summarising or paraphrasing the speech (or thought) of a character, without actually quoting the character's exact words.
punctuation	Use of <b>punctuation</b> in the middle of a line to create a pause.
vocabulary	<b>Vocabulary</b> means the words in a language.
imagery	The effective use of the adjective 'beautiful' help to create <b>imagery</b> for the reader.
emotive	<b>Emotive</b> language is language used to create emotion in the reader.
possibility	A verb which expresses necessity or <b>possibility</b> e.g. might, could, should.
informal	<b>Informal</b> language is used when you speak to your friends.
