bawl	The upset baby did nothing but <b>bawl</b> all night.
bury	My dog likes to <b>bury</b> bones.
brake	The car had to <b>brake</b> hard.
break	Be careful not to <b>break</b> that glass.
fair	Jane has <b>fair</b> hair.
fare	He lost his bus <b>fare</b> and had to walk all the way home.
grate	<b>Grate</b> some cheese to go in the sauce.
great	There was <b>great</b> relief at the rescue.
groan	She keeps moaning and groaning.
grown	I have <b>grown</b> tomatoes for ten years.
hear	Shout across the valley to <b>hear</b> the echo.
ball	He kicked the <b>ball</b> through the window.
berry	The holly <b>berry</b> is bright red.
here	Wait <b>here</b> until I get back.
