cough David has a bad cold and a **cough** .

though Even **though** it's winter the weather is not cold.

although I'm sick I'll still go to work.

dough Knead the **dough** to make the pizza.

through He kicked the ball **through** the window.

thorough This room needs a **thorough** clean.

borough The **borough** council studied the idea very thoroughly.

Plough the fields before sowing the seed.

bough The main branch of tree is called a **bough** .
