

## Spelling list: Doubling final consonant

If the last letter is a consonant and has a vowel before it the final letter is doubled.

forgetting	She is always <b>forgetting</b> where she has put her keys.
forgotten	You might have <b>forgotten</b> .
beginning	My hair is <b>beginning</b> to go grey.
preferred	She <b>preferred</b> cake to pudding.
permitted	It is not <b>permitted</b> to eat chewing gum in school.
regretting	Macbeth ends up <b>regretting</b> what he has done.
committed	Henry <b>committed</b> a serious crime - he forgot to say thank you!
forbidden	Nuts are <b>forbidden</b> in school.
propelled	The ship was <b>propelled</b> by the rota.
equipped	The kitchen is well <b>equipped</b> .
