

## Spelling list: *-ture* words - set 1 (copy)

In these words the final syllable has a weak sound, a bit like /cher/. This sound is usually spelled *ture* .

capture	There's a big reward for his <b>capture</b> .
feature	Persistent precipitation is an unfortunate <b>feature</b> of British weather.
fracture	Jane had a <b>fracture</b> in her right arm.
fixture	The display had become a permanent <b>fixture</b> at the museum.
future	In the foreseeable <b>future</b> .
lecture	The professor gave a <b>lecture</b> on ancient history.
mixture	An alloy is a <b>mixture</b> of metals.
moisture	Humidity is the amount of <b>moisture</b> in th air.
nature	The explorer was audacious by <b>nature</b> .
pasture	The cattle were grazed in the <b>pasture</b> .
posture	<b>Posture</b> is important when playing a musical instrument.
puncture	Tom had to submerge his bike tyre to find the <b>puncture</b> .
sculpture	His <b>sculpture</b> was carved from a block of stone.
structure	The pelvis, or pelvic bone, derived from the Latin word for 'basin', is an anatomical <b>structure</b> found in most vertebrates.
texture	Velvet has a very soft <b>texture</b> .
torture	<b>Torture</b> was widespread in the Middle Ages.
vulture	A <b>vulture</b> eats the flesh of dead creatures.
picture	His <b>picture</b> was on the front page.
