chronology	A timeline is a good way to show the <b>chronology</b> of historical events.
cause	A <b>cause</b> can be long or short term.
AD	<b>AD</b> means After Death.
consequence	There will be a <b>consequence</b> to a cause.
evidence	<b>Evidence</b> is primary or secondary sources that provide information about the past.
Bias	<b>Bias</b> means to favour something or someone over another.
Primary	<b>Primary</b> evidence is from that historical period of time. For example a Roman coin.
Secondary	<b>Secondary</b> evidence is from now but tells us about a historical period.
BC	<b>BC</b> means Before Christ.
Decade	A <b>decade</b> lasts for 10 years.
Century	A <b>century</b> lasts for 100 years. We are now in the 21st <b>century</b> .
Millennium	A <b>millennium</b> lasts for 1000 years.
Bog	The moist and rich soil where the Tollund man was found in 1950.
Interpretation	This is someones opinion on a historical event.
Fact	A <b>fact</b> is something you can prove is true with evidence.
Opinion	Your point of view but not based on facts.
