The prefix "in" usually means "not". It will give the root words the opposite meaning.

insane The high cost of the skiing trip was **insane**.

inexact He gave an **inexact** description of the criminal.

indirect He took an **indirect** route home from school.

informal The uniform for the school trip was very **informal** .
