The prefix "in" usually means "not". It will give the root words the opposite meaning.

insane	The high cost of the skiing trip was <b>insane</b> .
inexact	He gave an <b>inexact</b> description of the criminal.
indirect	He took an <b>indirect</b> route home from school.
informal	The uniform for the school trip was very <b>informal</b> .
injustice	People protested in the streets over the <b>injustice</b> they felt at raising more taxes.
