

## Spelling list: NATO phonetic alphabet - Part One

The NATO phonetic alphabet is a Spelling Alphabet, a set of words used instead of letters in oral communication (i.e. over the phone or military radio). Each word ("code word") stands for its initial letter (alphabetical "symbol"). The 26 code words in the NATO phonetic alphabet are assigned to the 26 letters of the English alphabet in alphabetical order as follows:

bravo	A shout of 'bravo!'.
Charlie	'Come over here!' Called <b>Charlie</b> .
delta	<b>Delta</b> is the fourth letter of the modern Greek alphabet.
Echo	Shout across the valley to hear the <b>echo</b> .
foxtrot	<b>Foxtrot</b> is a ballroom dance with a slow-slow-quick-quick rhythm.
golf	He won the <b>golf</b> match by one stroke.
hotel	There are no rooms free at the <b>hotel</b> .
India	She has a great desire to travel to <b>India</b> .
Juliett	<b>Juliett</b> is a girls name.
kilo	Mother weighed out a <b>kilo</b> of flour.
Lima	Ricky grandfather was born in <b>Lima</b> .
mike	<b>Mike</b> lent me \$100.
November	Bonfire Night is on the 5th of <b>November</b> .
alpha	<b>Alpha</b> is the first letter of the Greek alphabet.
