

## Spelling list: Adjectives ending in *ous* (copy)

When you hear the /us/ sound on the end of an adjective it is spelled *ous* .

adventurous	My Scout leader is very <b>adventurous</b> .
anonymous	I wonder who sent this <b>anonymous</b> letter.
disastrous	The General's battle plan was <b>disastrous</b> .
enormous	Elephants are <b>enormous</b> .
fabulous	Have a <b>fabulous</b> time at the party.
famous	Vin Scully is a <b>famous</b> baseball commentator.
generous	Thank you for your <b>generous</b> donation.
hazardous	Travel to Mars could be very <b>hazardous</b> .
jealous	She has a very <b>jealous</b> boyfriend.
joyous	The birth of their baby was a <b>joyous</b> occasion.
miraculous	He has made a <b>miraculous</b> recovery.
mischievous	He is not malicious, just a little <b>mischievous</b> .
momentous	Their wedding will be a <b>momentous</b> occasion.
mountainous	A large part of Austria is <b>mountainous</b> .
nervous	It was really clear that he was terribly <b>nervous</b> .
numerous	He has had <b>numerous</b> offers of employment.
prosperous	The film star is marrying a <b>prosperous</b> banker.
ravenous	Let's eat soon, I'm really <b>ravenous</b> .
ridiculous	The way he was behaving was a little bit <b>ridiculous</b> .
