

Spelling list: flossy words

When the sound f, l, s or z is heard after a short vowel at the end of a one-syllable word, we use the spelling ff, ll, ss or zz.

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| mess | Use the glue applicator to avoid mess . |
| fuss | Don't make a such a fuss about me being late. |
| kiss | He gave her a good luck kiss . |
| ill | Thinking you are ill all the time is hypochondria. |
| sniff | His cold made him sniff a lot. |
| stiff | After the car crash I had a stiff neck. |
| still | 'Aye' is an old way of saying 'yes', still used in Scotland. |
| fill | The quilt is filled with feathers from the eider duck. |
| Bell | The church bell was ringing. |
| sell | Don wants to sell his old car. |
| Mass | There is a mass of weeds in my garden. |
| smell | The foul smell made him retch. |
| spell | Some of these words are hard to spell . |
| spill | Detergent is often sprayed onto oil spills. |
| doll | Mia is given a doll for Christmas. |
