

## Spelling list: Doubling consonants or not! (copy)

If the last syllable of a word is stressed and ends with one consonant letter which has just one vowel letter before it, the final consonant letter is doubled before any ending with a vowel letter is added. The consonant letter is not doubled if the syllable is unstressed.

forgotten	You might have <b>forgotten</b> .
forgetting	Do you ever feel like you're <b>forgetting</b> something?
beginning	My hair is <b>beginning</b> to go grey.
beginner	She was an absolute <b>beginner</b> at the piano.
prefer	Kids <b>prefer</b> to wear casual clothes.
preferred	She <b>preferred</b> cake to pudding.
limiting	Have you tried <b>limiting</b> your time spent on the computer?
limited	His understanding of geography was <b>limited</b> .
limitation	The teacher set a <b>limitation</b> on the word-count.
bury	My dog likes to <b>bury</b> bones.
berry	The holly <b>berry</b> is bright red.
accept	I <b>accept</b> your apology.
except	I'll eat anything <b>except</b> bananas.
