

## Spelling list: Key Stage 3: Common Homophones and Confusions (part 2)

A number of secondary schools have identified the following words as common errors among this age group.

practice	Ballet dancers do hours of <b>practice</b> each day.
practise	You need to <b>practise</b> playing the violin to get better at it.
quiet	If the baby is asleep there is peace and <b>quiet</b> .
quite	He's <b>quite</b> good-looking.
sights	When I visited my Aunt in Paris, she offered to show me the <b>sights</b> .
sites	They filmed at various <b>sites</b> .
sauce	Grate some cheese to go in the <b>sauce</b> .
source	The <b>source</b> of this river is in those hills.
threw	They <b>threw</b> the ball back and forth.
through	He kicked the ball <b>through</b> the window.
to	That child is getting up <b>to</b> mischief again.
too	We ate far <b>too</b> much last night.
two	You can have either of these <b>two</b> cakes.
