alliteration	<b>Alliteration</b> involves words that begin with the same sound.
apostrophe	You can use an <b>apostrophe</b> to show possession. (Jane's blue car).
atmosphere	The writer varies her sentence lengths to create a tense <b>atmosphere</b> .
chorus	In Greek tragedy the <b>chorus</b> comments on the action.
clause	<b>Clause</b> is a sentence within another sentence.
comma	Use a <b>comma</b> to indicate pauses between parts of a sentence.
comparison	We need to make a <b>comparison</b> between these two poems.
conjunction	A word which joins other words together is called a <b>conjunction</b> .
consonant	A <b>consonant</b> is a letter in the alphabet that is not a vowel.
dialogue	The <b>dialogue</b> between the characters is very realistic.
exclamation	She let out a sudden <b>exclamation</b> of surprise.
