choir	The <b>choir</b> sang in church.
chord	A <b>chord</b> is a combination of three or more notes that blend harmoniously when sounded together.
chromatic	The violin played a <b>chromatic</b> melody.
composition	The crowd gathered in the hall to hear the young musicians play their exciting new <b>composition</b> .
conductor	The orchestra watched the <b>conductor</b> carefully.
crotchet	A <b>crotchet</b> is a quarter note.
dynamics	<b>Dynamics</b> concerns the volume of a sound or note.

minim	In American English, a <b>minim</b> is called a 'half note'.

octave	He was an <b>octave</b> too high.
