

## Spelling list: Words ending in *k/e* (copy)

The /k l/ sound at the end of a word can be spelled *k/e* , especially if the word has only two syllables.

ankle	I have a pain in my right <b>ankle</b> .
crackle	The fire started to <b>crackle</b> in the stove.
shackle	The prisoner was shackled to the wall.
tackle	The referee gave a free kick for a bad <b>tackle</b> .
sparkle	Her crystal beads <b>sparkle</b> in the sunlight.
freckle	Her freckles look very attractive.
heckle	The students decided to <b>heckle</b> the speaker.
speckle	The thrush is a bird with speckled plumage.
fickle	A <b>fickle</b> person changes their mind often.
pickle	I would like a cheese and <b>pickle</b> sandwich.
tickle	The feather will <b>tickle</b> my nose.
prickle	There was a <b>prickle</b> on the bush.
crinkle	The corners of his eyes <b>crinkle</b> when he smiles.
sprinkle	I like to <b>sprinkle</b> some chocolate on my coffee.
twinkle	<b>Twinkle</b> , <b>twinkle</b> little star.
wrinkle	Grandma says she has a new <b>wrinkle</b> every day.
buckle	Most belts tie with a <b>buckle</b> .
suckle	Baby mammals <b>suckle</b> as soon as they are born.
chuckle	He gave a <b>chuckle</b> at the joke.
