

## Spelling list: Words ending in *g/le* (copy)

The /g l/ sound at the end of a word is usually spelled *g/le* .

bugle	He played a <b>bugle</b> in the brass band.
angle	His body was bent at an awkward <b>angle</b> .
bangle	She wore a gold <b>bangle</b> on her wrist.
jangle	I can hear the chains <b>jangle</b> .
strangle	In the film he tried to <b>strangle</b> his enemy.
haggle	We will <b>haggle</b> to get a lower price.
giggle	The funny joke made the little girl <b>giggle</b> .
wiggle	Some people can <b>wiggle</b> their ears up and down.
mingle	The police will <b>mingle</b> amongst the crowd.
single	I don't believe a <b>single</b> word you said.
tingle	My hands are so cold they <b>tingle</b> .
juggle	This entertainer can <b>juggle</b> with six balls.
smuggle	It is illegal to <b>smuggle</b> forbidden goods.
struggle	The class will <b>struggle</b> to understand this poem.
jungle	The explorer was deep in the <b>jungle</b> .
burgle	Why did they choose to <b>burgle</b> you?
gurgle	The baby's <b>gurgle</b> delighted her dad.
squiggle	She signed her name with a <b>squiggle</b> .
wriggle	The cave explorers had to <b>wriggle</b> through the tunnel.
