

## Spelling list: *ought* and *aught* words (copy)

The letters *ought* and *aught* can be used to spell the sound /ort/.

| bought     | He <b>bought</b> me a huge bunch of flowers.         |
| brought    | The lost child was <b>brought</b> back home.         |
| thought    | I <b>thought</b> you'd be ready by now.              |
| sought     | They <b>sought</b> the escaped prisoner.             |
| nought     | <b>Nought</b> means nothing. (US spelling: naught).  |
| caught     | The thief was <b>caught</b> in the act.              |
| fraught    | <b>Fraught</b> means upset and worried.              |
| distraught | Lily was <b>distraught</b> at losing her pet kitten. |
| naughty    | Put that <b>naughty</b> child to bed early.          |
| haughty    | A <b>haughty</b> person thinks a lot of herself.     |
| daughter   | Our <b>daughter</b> has fair hair.                   |
| slaughter  | The army tried to stop the <b>slaughter</b> .        |
