

## Spelling list: *ought* and *aught* words (copy)

The letters *ought* and *aught* can be used to spell the sound /ort/.

bought	He <b>bought</b> me a huge bunch of flowers.
brought	The lost child was <b>brought</b> back home.
thought	I <b>thought</b> you'd be ready by now.
sought	They <b>sought</b> the escaped prisoner.
nought	<b>Nought</b> means nothing. (US spelling: naught).
caught	The thief was <b>caught</b> in the act.
fraught	<b>Fraught</b> means upset and worried.
distraught	Lily was <b>distraught</b> at losing her pet kitten.
naughty	Put that <b>naughty</b> child to bed early.
haughty	A <b>haughty</b> person thinks a lot of herself.
daughter	Our <b>daughter</b> has fair hair.
slaughter	The army tried to stop the <b>slaughter</b> .
