Poole	Richard <b>Poole</b> is Jekyll's butler.
Gabriel	<b>Gabriel</b> John Utterson is the narrator of the book.
Carew	Sir Danvers <b>Carew</b> is a member of Parliament, and a client of Utterson.
Guest	Mr. <b>Guest</b> is Utterson's clerk and confidant.
