naivety	<b>Naivety</b> is a lack of experience and wisdom.
bravery	<b>Bravery</b> is courage in daunting situations.

chivalry	<b>Chivalry</b> is polite and courteous behaviour, particularly towards women.
chivalrous	Knights were known to be gallant and <b>chivalrous</b> .
timeless	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. Arthur's stories are <b>timeless</b> because the themes apply to the modern day.
honour	<b>Honour</b> is the quality of knowing and doing what is morally right.
moral	The <b>moral</b> of a story is the lesson learnt by the reader based on the actions or mistakes made by the characters.
immoral	To be <b>immoral</b> is to behave terribly.
legends	<b>Legends</b> are extremely famous or notorious mythical characters, such as Arthur.
dominant	To be <b>dominant</b> is to have power and influence over others and to use it.
submissive	To be <b>submissive</b> is to be obedient and ready to conform to the will of others.
duel	A <b>duel</b> is a battle between two people. E.g, the swordsmen fought a <b>duel</b> .
deception	<b>Deception</b> is the action of tricking somebody by lying to them.
deceive	That liar tried to <b>deceive</b> me.
military	A country's army is sometimes referred to as the <b>military</b> .
