Spelling list: Words ending in -ic

There are two ways of spelling the /ik/ sound at the end of a word, but don't worry: there's a simple rule to help you remember which spelling pattern to use:

If a word has one syllable: use *ick* to spell the /*ik*/ sound at the end of a word. *BUT* if a word has two or more syllables, use *ic* to spell the /*ik*/ sound at the end of a word.

As the words in this list have more than one syllable, they use the -ic spelling.

-ic words are often nouns or adjectives. When they are adjectives, they are sometimes used to describe things that have the qualities or characteristics of a noun. For example, if something is *scientific*, it is associated with *science*.

attic We have stored our old CDs in the **attic**.

panic If she gets lost she will **panic**.

traffic The police started to divert the **traffic**.

comic The film was full of **comic** moments.

clinic She had an appointment at the antenatal **clinic**.

drastic He needs to make **drastic** cuts in his spending.

antic The clown got up to some silly antics.

basic Food is one of the **basic** needs for survival.

classic Classic cars can cost more than new ones.

drastic He needs to make **drastic** cuts in his spending.

arctic The North Pole is in the Arctic.

electric I used an **electric** whisk to make the cake.

athletic The basketball player was very **athletic**.

atlantic Our flight took us over the Atlantic.

aerobic I did an **aerobic** workout at the gym today.

dramatic The actor made a **dramatic** speech.

exotic There were many **exotic** fish in the tank.

dyslexic She loved stories even though she was **dyslexic** .
