altar	An altar is the structure upon which the Eucharist is celebrated.
apostolic	<b>Apostolic</b> succession the transmission of spiritual authority from the apostles through successive popes and bishops.
succession	Apostolic <b>succession</b> is the lineage of Popes and Bishops traced back to Peter and the apostles.
Anselm	St Anselm was an 11th century Christian philosopher and theologian.
ascension	The <b>ascension</b> of Jesus happened forty days after the resurrection.
Augustine	St Augustine was a 4th century Christian philosopher and theologian.
baptism	<b>Baptism</b> is the ceremony of initiation where a person becomes a child of God and part of the Church.
beatitudes	Beatitudes are the blessings taught by Jesus in the sermon on the mount.
creation	Creation refers to God bringing the world into existence.
creator	Christians believe there is one God, the <b>creator</b> of the universe.
crucifix	A crucifix is the image of the cross with Jesus on it.
conscience	Christians believe that the <b>conscience</b> is the guiding voice of God within a person.
denominations	Denominations are different groups within the Christian faith e.g. Anglican.
dignity	Dignity is the belief that humans are worthy of respect and honour.
discipleship	Discipleship is the act of following Jesus.
divine	The <b>Divine</b> Word is another name for Jesus, the son of God.

word	"The <b>Word</b> was made flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14) refers to Jesus.
duty	To have a <b>duty</b> is to have an obligation to act in a certain way.
eschatology	Eschatology is the part of theology concerned with life after death.
eternity	Eternity is the concept of endless life after death.
