Key words for GCSE Religious Studies.

Eucharist	Eucharist is the Christian sacrament commemorating the death and resurrection of Jesus.
Eucharistic acclamations	The Eucharistic acclamations are the words of praise spoken or sung during mass.
acclamations	Eucharistic acclamations are spoken or sung.
euthanasia	Euthanasia is the practice of intentionally ending a life to relieve suffering from disease.
evangelism	Evangelism is preaching the word of God to convert people to Christianity.
four	The four marks of the Church are the qualities that Jesus shares with his Church.
marks	The four marks of the church are 'one', 'holy', 'catholic' and 'apostolic'.
free	Free will refers to the ability to make ones own choices in life.
will	Christians believe that free will is a gift from God.
grace	Grace refers to God's benevolent nature and unconditional love.
Heaven	Heaven is the state of being with God for eternity.
Hell	Hell is a place of eternal suffering and being apart from God.
hierarchy	A hierarchy is the system of ranking status in an organization.
history	History is one of the literary forms within the Bible. They recount the stories of the early Church.
image	Image of God is the belief that humans share some of the characteristics of God.

imago	Imago Dei is another way of saying 'Image of God'.
Dei	Imago Dei is the belief that humans are created in God's image.
incarnation	Incarnation is the belief that God took on human form when appearing as Jesus.
incarnate	The Incarnate Son refers to Jesus and the belief in God as a person.
Son	Jesus is often referred to as the Incarnate Son .
