Key words for GCSE Religious Studies.

Eucharist	<b>Eucharist</b> is the Christian sacrament commemorating the death and resurrection of Jesus.
Eucharistic acclamations	The <b>Eucharistic</b> acclamations are the words of praise spoken or sung during mass.
acclamations	Eucharistic <b>acclamations</b> are spoken or sung.
euthanasia	<b>Euthanasia</b> is the practice of intentionally ending a life to relieve suffering from disease.
evangelism	<b>Evangelism</b> is preaching the word of God to convert people to Christianity.
four	The <b>four</b> marks of the Church are the qualities that Jesus shares with his Church.
marks	The four <b>marks</b> of the church are 'one', 'holy', 'catholic' and 'apostolic'.
free	<b>Free</b> will refers to the ability to make ones own choices in life.
will	Christians believe that free <b>will</b> is a gift from God.
grace	<b>Grace</b> refers to God's benevolent nature and unconditional love.
Heaven	<b>Heaven</b> is the state of being with God for eternity.
Hell	<b>Hell</b> is a place of eternal suffering and being apart from God.
hierarchy	A <b>hierarchy</b> is the system of ranking status in an organization.
history	<b>History</b> is one of the literary forms within the Bible. They recount the stories of the early Church.
image	<b>Image</b> of God is the belief that humans share some of the characteristics of God.

imago	<b>Imago Dei</b> is another way of saying 'Image of God'.
Dei	Imago <b>Dei</b> is the belief that humans are created in God's image.
incarnation	<b>Incarnation</b> is the belief that God took on human form when appearing as Jesus.
incarnate	The <b>Incarnate</b> Son refers to Jesus and the belief in God as a person.
Son	Jesus is often referred to as the Incarnate <b>Son</b> .
