Key words for GCSE Religious Studies.

Id-ul-Fitr	Id-ul-Fitr is the celebration at the end of Ramadan which marks the end of fasting.
imamate	The imamate is one of the Five Roots of Usul-ad-Din meaning Leadership.
immanence	Immanence is the belief that God is close to humanity.
Jibril	Jibril is the Angel who dictated the Qur'an to Muhammad.
jihad	Jihad means 'to struggle', it refers to a personal or collective struggle against evil.
judgement	The Day of Judgement is the day Allah will judge how we lived our earthly lives.
Jummah	Friday prayers in the mosque are called Jummah .
justice	In Shi'a Islam, God's justice is known as Adalat.
Ka'aba	Ka'aba is the cube shaped building in the centre of the Grand Mosque in Makkah.
Khums	Khums is the act of giving alms, one of the ten obligatory acts in Shi'a Islam.
lesser	Lesser jihad refers to the military struggle to defend Islam.
Makkah	Makkah is the spiritual centre of Islam.
mercy	Mercy refers to God's willingness to forgive our sins.
Mika'il	Mika'il is an Angel who offers spiritual and material help to humans.
mina	Mina is a pilgrimage site during Hajj.
monotheism	Monotheism is the belief in one God.
mosque	The Mosque is the Muslim place of worship.

Muhammad	In Islam Muhammad is the last and greatest prophet, he received the Qur'an.
Muzdalifah	Muzdalifah is a site of pilgrimage during Hajj where a night prayer is held.
