Key words for GCSE Religious Studies.

Id-ul-Fitr	<b>Id-ul-Fitr</b> is the celebration at the end of Ramadan which marks the end of fasting.
imamate	The <b>imamate</b> is one of the Five Roots of Usul-ad-Din meaning Leadership.
immanence	<b>Immanence</b> is the belief that God is close to humanity.
Jibril	<b>Jibril</b> is the Angel who dictated the Qur'an to Muhammad.
jihad	<b>Jihad</b> means 'to struggle', it refers to a personal or collective struggle against evil.
judgement	The Day of <b>Judgement</b> is the day Allah will judge how we lived our earthly lives.
Jummah	Friday prayers in the mosque are called <b>Jummah</b> .
justice	In Shi'a Islam, God's <b>justice</b> is known as Adalat.
Ka'aba	<b>Ka'aba</b> is the cube shaped building in the centre of the Grand Mosque in Makkah.
Khums	<b>Khums</b> is the act of giving alms, one of the ten obligatory acts in Shi'a Islam.
lesser	<b>Lesser</b> jihad refers to the military struggle to defend Islam.
Makkah	<b>Makkah</b> is the spiritual centre of Islam.
mercy	<b>Mercy</b> refers to God's willingness to forgive our sins.
Mika'il	<b>Mika'il</b> is an Angel who offers spiritual and material help to humans.
mina	<b>Mina</b> is a pilgrimage site during Hajj.
monotheism	<b>Monotheism</b> is the belief in one God.
mosque	The <b>Mosque</b> is the Muslim place of worship.
