Brutus	<b>Brutus</b> is a supporter of the republic.

Casca	<b>Casca</b> is a public figure opposed to Caesar's rise to power.
Calpurnia	<b>Calpurnia</b> is Caesar's wife.
Portia	<b>Portia</b> is Brutus's wife.
Flavius	<b>Flavius</b> is a tribune (an official elected by the people to protect their rights).
Cicero	<b>Cicero</b> speaks at Caesar's triumphal parade.
Lepidus	<b>Lepidus</b> is the third member of Antony and Octavius's coalition.
Murellus	Like Flavius, <b>Murellus</b> is a tribune who condemns the plebeians for their fickleness in cheering Caesar.
Decius	<b>Decius</b> is a member of the conspiracy.
