Brutus	Brutus is a supporter of the republic.
Caesar	Caesar is a great Roman general and senator.

Antony	Antony claims allegiance to Brutus.
Cassius	Cassius is a talented general and long time acquaintance of Caesar.
Octavius	Octavius is Caesar's adopted son and appointed successor.
Casca	Casca is a public figure opposed to Caesar's rise to power.
Calpurnia	Calpurnia is Caesar's wife.
Portia	Portia is Brutus's wife.
Flavius	Flavius is a tribune (an official elected by the people to protect their rights).
Cicero	Cicero speaks at Caesar's triumphal parade.
Lepidus	Lepidus is the third member of Antony and Octavius's coalition.
Murellus	Like Flavius, Murellus is a tribune who condemns the plebeians for their fickleness in cheering Caesar.
Decius	Decius is a member of the conspiracy.
