

## Spelling list: *wh* - the question words

Many common question words in English start with *wh* , like *what* , *when* , and *where* . While these words all begin with *wh* , they can be a little confusing because the letters don't always make the sound you'd expect.

In words like *what* and *where* , the *wh* is pronounced as /w/. However, in words like *who* and *whom* , it sounds more like /h/ .

This can trip you up at first, but once you learn these words, the different sounds will start to feel more familiar. Keep practising and soon you'll find them much easier to use!

what	<b>What</b> time is it?
when	<b>When</b> are you going to the shop?
where	<b>Where</b> have I put my keys?
which	<b>Which</b> cake would you like for dessert?
why	<b>Why</b> are you crying?
who	<b>Who</b> would like to go first?
whom	To <b>whom</b> is the letter addressed?
whose	<b>Whose</b> book is this?
whether	I can't decide <b>whether</b> I should go into town or not.
